

# Ski first, spa later

Taking note of the Swiss experience, Victorian ski fields offer soothing retreats for shocked muscles, writes **Rachael Oakes-Ash**

**R**ECREATIONAL skiers use more than 16 core muscles from the hamstrings to the glutes when burning down the piste.

You'll know the others when you wake the next day after your first day of the snow season.

Massage helps keep the muscles limber, which means less chance of injury and more chance of you actually enjoying your seven days on the snow each year.

There's nothing like sore muscles to keep you under the duvet while your mates are making hay on the powder.

The Swiss know about the soothing power of alpine spas. The Victorian ski fields have taken note with Australia's first alpine ski-in, ski-out spa retreats.

The Endota Day Spa at Falls Creek is part of the glamorous Aspen-styled HUSKI complex of boutique apartments. Opening its doors for the first time this season, Endota is a true ski-in spa destination.

Think native Australian aromatherapy and treatments designed not just for females.

"Bloke massage" is tailored specifically for the male physique using "made for man" herbs. The Billabong Footbath of lemon myrtle and native mint foot soak and massage is the perfect antidote for feet bound up tight in ski boots.

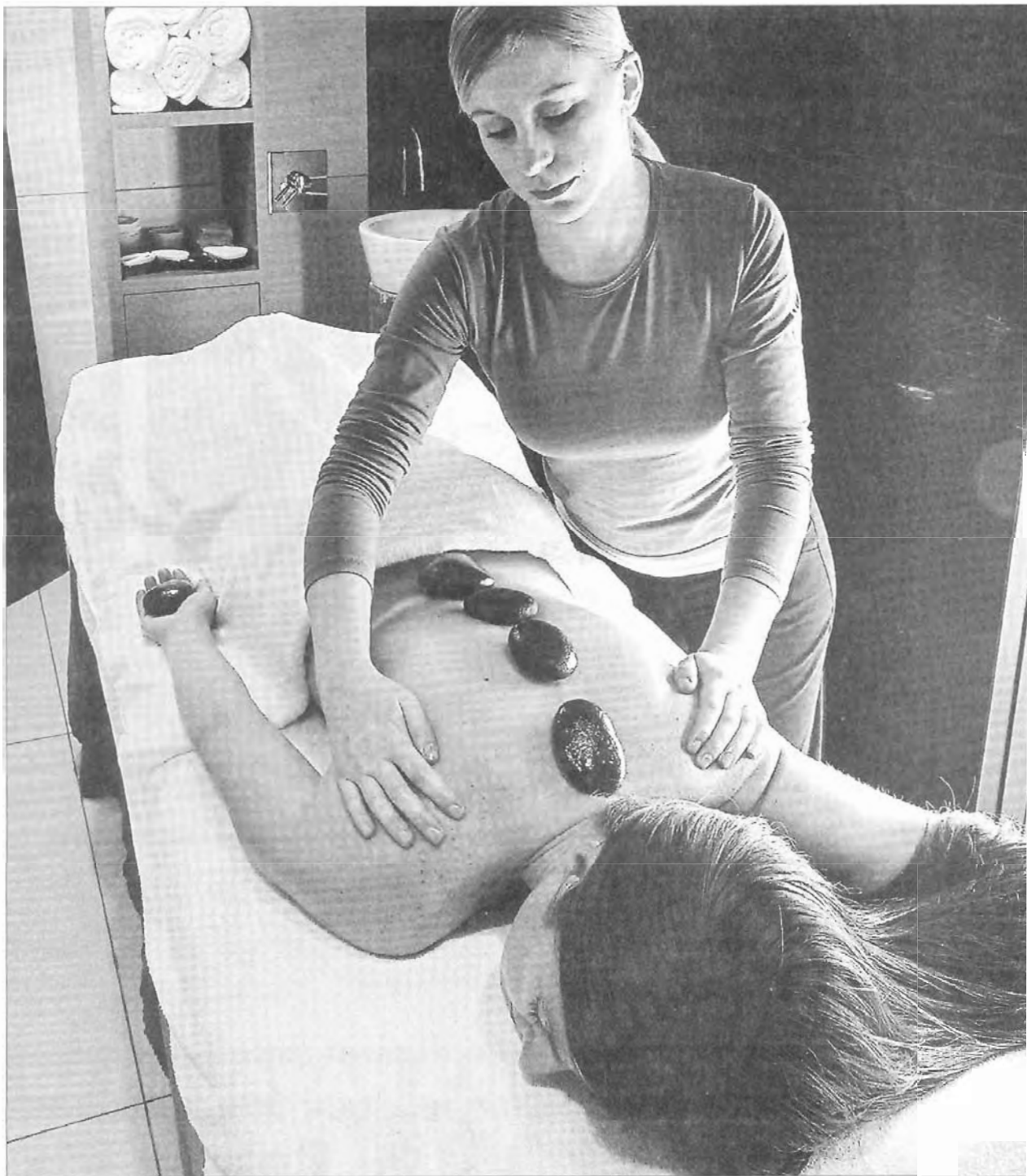
For pure blizzard-bliss the Never Never Land Treatment is 3½ hours of massage, exfoliation and Australian clay cocooning. Or choose the Witchetty Scrub to slough away dead cells.

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MT HOTHAM has gone the holistic route with the opening of the White Mountain Day Spa this season. At a cost of \$500,000, and designed by Italian architect Giovanni Amborossie, The White Mountain Spa Retreat features floor-to-ceiling glass for ethereal views of Swindlers Valley.

The complex is owned by two local Hotham skiers, Allison McEwan and Lisa Parkinson, who understand the specific needs of ski-weary bodies.

As a result the White Mountain Day Spa concentrates on alpine-focused products and treatments.

The Pevonnia Swiss-formulated facial products for intense hydration will keep ski widows happy for hours. East blends with west in the Reiki and Guasha treatments – Reiki for healing heat and Guasha-style massage to release heat toxins in the muscles.

MT BULLER'S Breathtaker All-Suite Hotel and Spa Retreat features the Breathtaker on High spa and is Australia's only alpine destination spa. The multimillion-dollar spa complex was opened in 2001 and has set the standard for alpine spa in Australia.

At Breathtaker on High it's all about the water. Geisha hot tubs, jacuzzis, water treatments and a window-edged lap pool are set in exposed stone surroundings.

The heat from water and air jets helps relax muscles before massage and assists aching ski joints to unwind.

The good news is it's strictly adults only so there are no screaming children to break the bliss. Couple treatments feature double geisha hot tub treatments and double massage rooms for time out together.

Stay at the Breathtaker All Suite hotel and you can be carried to your room post-treatment.
